Engineer Critical Of Bridge St. Plans

A review of state plans for the Bridge St. Improvement in East Syracuse indicates that the proposed facilities would isolate sewer and water lines and make them inaccessible to adjacent lands, Village Engineer Anthony J. Malley told the Village Board Monday. He said there is a problem with sewer and water line relocation in the state DPW plans for widening and improving Bridge St. and the Bridge St., Genesee St. Interchange. Mr. Malley suggested that the state be asked to extend water and sewer mains the entire length of access roads so as to provide utilities to abutting owners the same as they are now provided by existing facilities.

THE TRUSTEES DISCUSSED a request by J. F. Friedel Paper Box Co. on Second St. for

permission to extend its building. Original plans showed the construction would extend over sewer mains. Village Attorney George Doyle said the company will cooperate in making necessary changes. The board will issue a permit upon recommendation of the village engineer.

Four bids to supply the Department of Public Works with a new truck were opened. P&D GMC Sales, Syracuse, gave the lowest bid of \$1,688, East Syracuse Sales was second with \$1,730, International Harvester \$1,776.36, and Sam Dell Dodge \$1,824. Bids were tabled for further study.

The board will hold an informal meeting Monday, May 29, to finalize fiscal plans for the fiscal year beginning June 1.
