

National Youth Leadership Training is...

NYLT is a week- long outdoor experience for current and future troop and crew leaders, utilizing the patrol (team) method. It presents leadership skills in multiple formats providing the opportunity for participants to live and practice these leadership skills. Virtually all of the training is conducted by the youth staff. The course follows the National BSA National Youth Leadership Training Curriculum.



Why should Youth attend?

- You'll have fun!
- The leadership skills we teach will help you within scouting, in school and later in life.
- Your regular troop/crew job will become more fun.
- You'll make new friends
- You'll have fun!!

Why should Unit Leaders send Youth?

- ❖ *We provide intensive leadership training in a controlled environment that would be difficult for you to reproduce.*
- ❖ *Trained leaders make scouting fun for the rest of your troop/crew members.*
- ❖ *You'll take pride watching your Youth Leaders run the troop/crew.*

Who can attend?

NYLT is for you if you're a **Boy Scout** who can answer **YES** to **All** of the following:

- You'll be 13 years old by July 27, 2014;
- You will not be 18 years old before August 2, 2014.
- You'll be at least a first class Scout by May 10, 2014;
- You now hold or intend to hold a unit leadership position;
- You have completed Introduction to Leadership Skills For Troops.
- You are mature enough and responsible enough to spend one full week camping with youth you've never met, with minimal adult supervision, and always live the Scout oath and law;
- You agree to practice the skills you learn at NYLT when you return to your home unit.

AND

- Your parents and Unit Leader agree and recommend you.

NYLT is for you if you're in **Venturing** and can answer **YES** to **All** of the following:

- You are at least 14 years old by July 27, 2014;
- You will not be 21 years old before August 2, 2014.
- You have completed Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews.
- You are mature enough and responsible enough to spend one full week camping* with others you've never met, with minimal adult supervision, and always live the Venturing oath and code;
- You agree to practice the skills you learn at NYLT when you return to your home unit;

AND

- Your parents and Unit Leader agree and recommend you.

* The Course leaders will work with you in advance if you do not have extensive camping skills.

The Unit Leaders Role?

The Unit Leader's role is critical to the success of the youth leader in implementing his/her goals.

The Unit Leader must approve the youth's application.

Ensure that each youth leader has completed Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops/Crews training.

How is the course setup?

The patrol (team) method is used extensively throughout the training. Patrols (Teams) are on their own to set up campsites, cook meals and carry out other activities without direct adult supervision. A Troop Guide (Team Guide) is assigned to each patrol (team) to advise and be a resource to the participants throughout the learning process. The Troop (Group) setting provides an opportunity for youth to practice the newly learned skills providing the home unit with improved effectiveness and enthusiasm from the youth leaders. Troop (Group) instructors will help guide this learning. The training guidelines and rules are the same for those found in the Scout Oath and Law, the Venturing Code and Oath, the Outdoor Code, and other national and council practices and procedures.

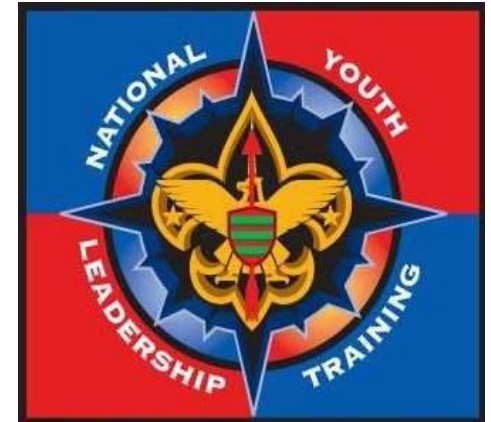

The cost is \$225.00

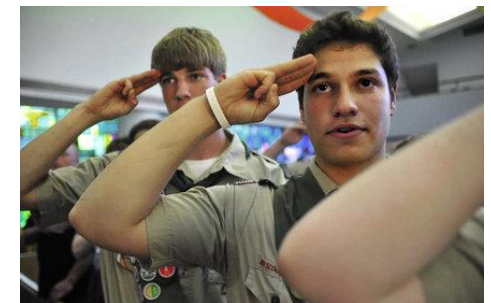
All fees are refundable until June 30th, after that date all fees are not refundable. However, they are transferable to another Scout / Venture candidate.
